WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States the ~~Placer~~ ^{Mineral} Certificate of Survey and the Certificate No. ~~44753~~ of the Register of the Land Office at ~~Lagadiller~~ ^{Lagadiller} in the State of Colorado, accompanied by other evidence, whereby it appears that.....

W. H. Clark

did, on the ~~thirtieth~~ ^{first} day of ~~May~~, A. D. 1800, duly enter and pay for that certain PLACER mining claim and premises designated by the Surveyor General as Lot No. 13,058, containing the Lots 97, 98 and 99, Year placer mining claims, and embracing a portion of sections eighteen, nineteen and thirty, in township seven south of range forty-six west, and of township seven south of range forty-seven west, and of township seven south of range forty-eight west, and of township seven south of range forty-nine west, and of township seven south of range forty-eight west, Sixth Principal Meridian bearing south seventy-three degrees and one minute east more bounded and described and platted as follows, with magnetic variation fourteen degrees and thirty minutes east:

Beginning for the description of the 97 placer claim at corner No 1, a granite stone 6 x 12 x 26 inches, chiseled 1-1-13358 with monogram of stone from which the west-quarter-corner of section Thirty in Township seven south of range forty-six west, Sixth Principal meridian bears south seventy-three degrees and one minute east more bounded and fifty-two and nine-tenths feet distant, and a bed rock, soft-bear south-south-thirteen degrees east one thousand one hundred and twenty feet distant. Hence, first course, south-south-thirteen degrees east eight hundred and ten feet Blue river; one thousand and forty-five feet above the ditch, two thousand four hundred and forty-three and seven-tenths feet to corner No 2. Hence, second course, south twelve degrees and one minute west two thousand two hundred and eighty-six and seventy-eight hundredths feet to corner No 3. Hence, third course, north-north-eight degrees and twenty-three minutes west two thousand one hundred feet said Blue river. Two thousand seven hundred and seventy-four feet to corner No 4. Hence, fourth course, north-nineteen degrees and one minute east two thousand and fifty-six and one tenth feet to corner No 1, the place of beginning.

Beginning for the description of the 97 placer claim at corner No 1 identified with corner No 1 of said No 5 placer claims. Hence, first course,

south seventy-three degrees east eight hundred and ten feet said Blue river, one thousand and seventy feet said ditch; two thousand four hundred and ninety-three and seven-tenths feet to corner No. 2 identical with corner No. 2 of said 96 plac claim. Hence, second course, north forty-four minutes west two thousand four hundred and ninety-five feet said ditch, three thousand and fifty-six and twenty-four hundredths feet to corner No. 3, Hence, third course, north eighty degrees and eleven minutes west fifty-eight feet said Blue river; one thousand four hundred and thirty-nine and four tenths feet to corner No. 4. Hence, fourth course, south seventeen degrees and forty-four minutes west two thousand one hundred and eighteen and eight-tenths feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning.

Beginning for the description of the 96 placer claim at corner No. 1, a granite stone 12 x 12 x 26 inches, circled 2-1-13358, with mound of stone, identical with corner No. 4 of said 97 placer claim, from which a spruce tree, six inches in diameter, blazed and marked B.T2-1-13358, bears south seventeen degrees east thirty-three and six tenths feet distant; said quarter section corner bears south one degree and twenty-one minutes east two thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and nine tenths feet distant, and a shaft bears north twenty-two degrees and fifteen minutes east one thousand one hundred and forty feet distant. Hence, first course, north ten degrees and twenty minutes east four thousand one hundred and fifty-eight and six tenths feet to corner No. 2. Hence, second course, south eighty-seven degrees and ten minutes east three hundred and ninety feet said Blue river, one hundred and ninety-seven and four tenths feet to corner No. 3, Hence, third course, south three degrees and two minutes west five hundred and thirty-nine and twenty-five and twenty-five hundredths feet to corner No. 4. Hence, fourth course, north eight-seven degrees and forty-two minutes east one thousand one hundred and sixty-one and seven-tenths feet to corner No. 5. Hence, fifth course, south twenty-four degrees and fourteen minutes west six hundred and fifty-nine and twenty-seven hundredths feet to corner No. 6. Hence, sixth course, south thirty-three degrees and forty minutes west one thousand four hundred and fifty feet to corner No. 7. Hence, seventh course, south fifty-six degrees and twenty minutes east one hundred and fifty feet to corner No. 8. Hence, eighth course, south twelve degrees and twenty-four minutes west one thousand one hundred and fifty-nine and four tenths feet to corner No. 9, identical with corner No. 3 of said 97 placer claim. Hence, ninth course, north eighty degrees and eleven minutes west fifty-eight feet said Blue river, one thousand four hundred and thirty-nine and four tenths feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning.

Beginning for the description of the Deep Gear placer claim at corner No. 1, a cross (+) at corner point, and 2-1-13358 circled in a granite boulder in place, 2½ x 2½ x 1 feet above the general surface, identical with corner No. 2 of said 96 placer claim, from which a spruce tree, six inches in diameter, blazed and marked B.T2-1-13358 bears south sixty degrees east six and four tenths feet distant, said quarter section corner bears south five degrees and twenty-one minutes west one thousand one hundred and ninety-nine and forty-four hundredths feet distant; the south quarter corner of section eighteen, said township and range bears north thirty-seven degrees and forty-seven minutes east two thousand one hundred and forty-nine and six tenths feet distant, and a shaft bears north fourteen degrees and ten minutes east two thousand one hundred and forty-nine feet distant. Hence, first course, north three degrees and twenty-one minutes east two thousand two hundred and five feet, or two thousand one

and twenty-four feet of Prince Creek, four thousand three hundred and twenty-nine
are fifty-one hundredths feet to corner No. 2. Hence, second course, north twenty-five
degrees and nineteen minutes east, seven hundred and eighty-two and Twenty-five
hundredths feet to corner No. 3. Hence, third course, north eighty-eight degrees
and forty-four minutes east, three hundred and seven feet to corner No. 4. Hence
fourth course, north eighty-seven degrees, and forty-six minutes east, two hundred
and seventy-seven feet to corner No. 5. Hence, fifth course, north fifty-eight de-
grees and forty-four minutes east, one hundred and eighty feet and Blue river,
one thousand six hundred and forty-three feet to corner No. 6, a pine post seven
miles square marked A-5225, with mound of stone, situated with cor-
ner No. 1, of survey No. 5225, the Golden Crown placer claim, from which No. 5225
stone monument and author bears south eighty-four degrees, and four minutes
east, eight hundred and sixty-four and one tenth feet distant. Hence, with
course, south twenty-five degrees, and fifty minutes west, seven hundred and
thirty-one and nine tenths feet to corner No. 7. Hence, seventh course, south eighty-
seven degrees and thirty-one minutes west, four hundred and twenty-five feet
and Blue river, one hundred and ninety-nine, and four tenths feet to corner
No. 8. Hence, eighth course, south two degrees and thirty-seven minutes west
four hundred and thirty-five and one Blue river, three thousand eight hundred
and fifty-one, and three tenths feet to corner No. 9, containing with corner No. 3, of
the 96 placer claim. Hence, ninth course, north eighty-seven degrees and
two minutes west, five hundred and seventy-nine and four tenths feet, said Blue
river, one hundred and ninety-seven and four tenths feet to corner No. 1, the
place of beginning.

Said Lot No. 13358 containing four hundred and fifty acres and four
hundred and fifty-seven thousandths of an acre of land, more or less.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore hereby GRANTED by the UNITED STATES unto the said

W. H. Banc

and to Lis Leuris and assigns, the said placer mining premises hereinbefore described,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD Said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said grantees above named, and to Lis Leuris and assigns forever; subject, nevertheless, to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST—That the grant hereby made is restricted in its exterior limits to the boundaries of the said mining premises, and to any veins or lodes of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, which may have been discovered within said limits subsequent to and which were not known to exist on the sixth day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and

SECOND—That should any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, be claimed or known to exist within the above described premises at said last-named date, the same is expressly excepted and excluded from these presents.

THIRD—That the premises hereby conveyed may be entered by the proprietor of any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, for the purpose of extracting and removing the ore from such vein or lode, should the same, or any part thereof, be found to penetrate, intersect, pass through or dip into the mining ground or premises hereby granted.

FOURTH—That the premises hereby conveyed shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs and decisions of courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditched or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

FIFTH—That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of Florida may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to the complete development thereof.
